Read books together.

Reading to your child encourages them to explore books. Try to use big books to help focus your child's attention. Extenuate words and their sounds, and encourage your child to copy. 10-minute activity

Use books with expressions and encourage your child to copy you when creating sounds in books, such as 'whoosh', 'bang', etc.

Mark a tick when completed.

Storytelling,

Give your child a set of pictures; try to choose around three or more random ones.

Ask your child to tell you a story about the pictures. Use openended questions, like 'What is happening in the story?'

Encourage expansion on the story by giving them points to work on, for example, 'Who is in your story', 'Where did they go?' etc.

- 5-minute activity.

When your child is telling you the story, listen intently so that they know they are being paid attention to too. Children will shy away from talking if they feel that they are not being listened to or ignored. This could result in a lack of confidence.

Join in playing with your child.

Ask them questions like, 'What are we playing?', 'What have you got there?'

Children share their ideas and can appear more relaxed when participating in an activity of their choosing. This is an excellent opportunity to engage in role-play.

Mark a tick when completed.

Start the game by saying, 'I went shopping, and today I bought..."

Then say what you bought.

Then encourage your child to take a turn, repeat the first sentence, and say, 'You went shopping, and today you bought..."

Encourage your child to think of something you buy at the shops.

Repeat as necessary.

– 10 minutes activity.

Encourages imagination and open-ended conversation.

This gets the child thinking about items and how to say their names.

Teaches turn-taking and responding appropriately to relevant questions. Introduces back-and-forth interaction.
